Spears Cross is situated in the medieval and picturesque village of Dunster, considered to be the most outstanding village in the Exmoor National Park. The house dates from 1460 and is characterised by many attractive period features.

Offering four en-suite rooms, comfortable lounge and a traditional linen tabled dining room; Spears Cross provides a touch of quality.



Charm and Heritage

The comfortable lounge has wooden flooring, ceiling beams and an inglenook fireplace with an ornate wood burning stove.

The dining room retains the servants' bell. The landing features elm panelling. Three bedrooms enjoy wooden flooring and two of the rooms have elm wall panelling. A suite, at the rear of the property, is perfect for longer holiday breaks. All bedrooms are en-suite and offer premium quality Relyon Super King Size beds. All have flat screen television, Bose Music System, magazines, tea and coffee making facilities, fresh fruit, bottled local spring water, hair dryer, Penhaligon's toiletries and quality bathrobes.

A hearty breakfast sets you up for the day and is an important part of enjoying a holiday break.

Spears Cross features local and organic produce where possible. We have given breakfast an Exmoor flavour, making it something special. Living here in Dunster, we are spoilt with wonderful local produce. Our bacon is locally smoked and our sausages are specially made for us from free range, rare breed pigs. Bread made from flour from the nearby Water Mill is available. Handmade, small batch Marmalade, fresh fruit jams, Whortleberry jam and local honey are waiting to be enjoyed! Cheeses are locally produced. Apple juice comes

from a local farm and orange and grapefruit juice are freshly squeezed by us each morning. Smoked Haddock, locally Smoked Trout or Porridge can be ordered the night before.

We are happy to give you the contact details of our suppliers. Some of the goods are available from shops locally. With the wonders of the web many have a mail order facility, so you can treat yourself at any time of the year!

Dunster is Unique

A medieval village boasting over 100 Grade 2 listed buildings and 6 Grade 1 listed buildings and many dating over 500 years; Dunster is unique. The Castle lies at the heart of the village and is owned by the National Trust. A visit is very worthwhile and the garden, with sub tropical plants and Strawberry Trees is a joy. Another Trust property, a working Water Mill, is just 4 minutes walk from Spears Cross and here you can purchase stone ground flour.

The popular hymn "All things bright and beautiful" was written on Grabbist Hill by Mrs Cecil Frances Alexander in 1848. The purple headed mountain refers to Grabbist Hill and the river running by is the Avill.

Directions to Spears Cross Bed & Breakfast.

Exit the M⁵ at junction 24 and follow the Minehead (A39) signs through Bridgwater. Turn left off the A39, signposted Dunster Village some 2 miles before Minehead. Once in the village, continue past the Yarn Market. Go through the traffic lights into Church Street. Church Street broadens into West Street and bears sharp left. Spears Cross is the first property on the left, by the entrance to Dunster Castle. There is a small parking area to the left of the property. Once you arrive, sit, relax and enjoy some Tea and home-made Cake.

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
